Grading and Condition

SuperbExtraordinary item in the finest condition.Extremely FineOutstanding and exceptional quality.

Very Fine Choice, first-class condition.

Fine-Very Fine (F-VF) Stamp or cover in sound condition; if a stamp, it is slightly less well-centered than Very Fine but

better centered than Fine.

Fine Sound in all respects. Perforated stamps will have the designs clear of the perforations; the designs

of imperforate stamps will not be cut in to any significant degree.

Very Good (VG) Imperfect centering (stamps) or poor general appearance.

Any stamp faults such as a thin spot, tear, crease etc., will be described at all times. In such cases, the grade will generally have the word "appearance" added to reflect how it appears despite the flaws.

Postally used covers should be expected to have the normal degree of wear associated with them including minor nicks, short edge tears, flap tears and slight reduction at one side. These are normal conditions for 19th century envelopes and not grounds for return. Folded letters should be expected to have at least one file fold.

In lots containing several items, degrees of condition denote the overwhelming average and examples above and below such condition can be expected.

Terms of Sale

The property offered in this catalog will be sold at public auction by Kewriga Auctions on behalf of various consignors and itself or affiliated parties. The placing of a bid, whether directly or through an agent by any means (in person, telephone, fax, internet, etc), the bidder acknowledges and agrees to the following conditions of sale.

Bidding

- 1. All bids (whether by floor bidders, mail bidders, or telephone bidders) will have a premium of **18%** added to the auction sale price.
- 2. All bids are per lot as numbered in the catalog unless otherwise announced by the auctioneer at the time of sale. The right is reserved to withdraw any lot prior to sale, to divide a lot, or to group two or more lots, or to act on behalf of the seller. Kewriga Auctions will execute bidding instructions on behalf of clients, but will not be responsible for any errors in the execution of such bids. Kewriga Auctions is not liable for bidding errors related to live auction internet bidding and/or the loss of internet connection during the live auction.
- 3. The highest bidder shall prevail; lots are sold at one increment over the second highest bid. Should any dispute arise between bidders, the decision of the auctioneer as to the successful bidder and the reoffering or resale of the lot under dispute shall rest entirely on the judgment of the auctioneer. The auctioneer shall regulate the bidding and reserve the right to refuse any bid believed by him not to be made in good faith.
- 4. Consignor has and retains the right to bid personally, or by his duly appointed agent, through the auctioneer, unless the sale is advertised and announced as one restricting such bidding by consignors or their agents.

Purchase Payment

- 5. FLOOR BIDDERS. Floor bidders shall furnish the auctioneer their names and addresses prior to bidding on any lot. The name and address of the buyer of each lot shall be registered with the auction house following the sale of each lot. Payment of the whole purchase price shall be made by the floor buyer in such manner as the auctioneer may determine. Special credit arrangements must be made prior to the sale.
- 6. MAIL BIDDERS. A successful mail bidder will be notified of lots purchased and must remit payment before the lots are sent. Auction bills are due and payable upon receipt of notification. If buyer's payment is not received within ten (10) days, Kewriga Auctions may resell all lots without notice. Any and all losses incurred as a result of resale will be passed on to the defaulting buyer.
- 7. BANK TRANSFERS. A successful mail bidder known to us for the information necessary to pay directly into the vendor bank account. Any additional charges resulting from processing payments by this method shall be borne by the buyer. Method of payment should be noted on the bid sheet.

- 9. All of our lots are sold as genuine. Lots accompanied by recent (within 5 years of sale date) expert certificates are sold "as is" based on the description in the certificate. The aforementioned expertized lots may not be returned under any circumstances including those instances in which subsequent certificates yield conflicting opinions. The accepted authorities for U.S. stamps are the Philatelic Foundation (P.F.), the Philatelic Stamp Authentication and Grading, Inc. (P.S.A.G.) and the Professional Stamp Expertizing Committee (P.S.E.). In addition, a lot may not be returned because an expertising service grades a stamp lower than the grade stated in the description, or differs from the accompanying certificate.

- 10. The Auctioneer must be notified within 5 business days from the date of the auction of any request to place a lot on extension for expertising. All extensions must be paid in full, in advance. There will be no exceptions and no lots may be returned under any circumstances if this term has not been strictly followed.
- All lots on extension must be submitted for expertising by the auctioneer exclusively. Each lot is sold as genuine, except those described "as is", but when, in the opinion of a competent authority acceptable to Kewriga Auctions, the lot is declared otherwise, the purchase price will be refunded in full. 1002 Overland Via Los Angeles, illustrated six-horse stagecoach design with Randal & Co. of Marysville imprint on yellow cover bearing well centered **10¢ green (35)** tied by large blue segmented cor"Overland Mail, Via Los Angeles"k cancel, matching "Marysville Cal. Dec 4" cds on yellow cover to Lyons, Iowa, **Very Fine and choice**, *ex-Haas*, *Edwards*.

Western Express Covers



1003 Adams & Co., Sacramento (Thomas ADA-100c) blue express company double-circle datestamp cancels 3¢ red (U2) buff entire with Nesbitt seal on backflap to San Francisco; barely reduced at left with some insignificant creases, Very Fine, the double-circle cancel was used by Adams & Co. for only a short period of time. Estimate \$150 - 200

Batchelder's Express (Aug. 1861 - Feb. 1862)



"Batchelders Express" (Thomas BAT-100) manuscript express company marking and "50cts" express rating on "The Union Forever" Flag Patriotic cover with Gen. Dix inscription bearing 3¢ dull red (26) tied by blue grid, matching "Keokuk, Iowa datestamp from the James Stuart correspondence to Fort Owens, Flathead Country, Washington Territory, endorsed "Via Walla Walla" at lower left, bold San Francisco "Due 7" handstamp crossed out by Batchelders when express rated; some edge wear and reduced slightly at right, flap missing, Very Fine and rare, ex-Edwards.

ONE OF ONLY TWO RECORDED BATCHELDERS EXPRESS USES, A REMARKABLE WASHINGTON TERRITORY EXPRESS PATRIOTIC USE.

Little in the way of historical information is available concerning the operation of this express. It is assumed that it operated from some point on the Oregon Trail, most likely Fort Bridger or Fort Hall, and apparently carried mail into the Bitterroot Valley. It appears to have been a small, one- or two-man operation that functioned for a short period of time.

In 1850, Major John Owen established Fort Owen, a trading post and fort in the Bitterroot River Valley. This outpost was located about 25 miles south of present-day Missoula, Montana. Several covers are addressed to Mr. Stuart (also spelled "Stewart") at this location, including some via Bannack Express.

Despite the "via Walla" endorsement, it is likely this cover most likely came to the Oregon Trail and was passed to Batchelder's Express at some point on the trail.

Nov 30" cds duplexed with cork cancel on 1878 cover to New York N.Y., original matching illustrated letterhead with "Coast Line Stage & Express Line" heading, some separations, Very Fine, ex-Haas, Edwards.

THE FINEST RECORDED EXAMPLE OF THIS COAST LINE STAGE CO. SAN FRANCISCO ILLUSTRATED COVER.

Most of the recorded examples of this scarce Coast Line Stage Co. illustrated design are badly reduced into the stamp. This company is supposed to have carried the U.S. mail and Wells Fargo Express from San Francisco to points south between 1868 and the late 1870s.



1006 Eureka Express Co., Paid, Columbian Issue (Thomas EUR-003) blue printed frank on 2¢ Columbian (U349) entire to North Bloomfield Cal., with enclosure datelined "Nevada City, May 17, 1895"; small nick at bottom, F.-V.F. and scarce Columbian frank.

From a base at North Bloomfield, California this express operated between the north and south forks of the Yuba River serving the Eureka mining areas. They connected with Wells Fargo at Nevada City and North San Juan.

G. H. Wines & Co.'s California Express



1007 G. H. Wines & Co.'s California Express (Thomas WIE-101) spectacular printed frank with elaborate eagle and shield design on 3¢ red (U10) buff Nesbitt entire canceled by blue "Rhodes & Whitney's Express, Weaverville" express oval to Shasta Cal.; some light wrinkling, Very Fine and rare, ex-Edwards.

AN OUTSTANDING WESTERN EXPRESS COVER WITH THE RARE WINES & COMPANY'S PRINTED FRANK USING A PATRIOTIC MOTIF.

G.H. Wines was based in San Francisco and ran into Sacramento. From these locations they extended into both the northern and southern mining areas of early California., and into Oregon through the use of other feeder expresses. They had offices in Sacramento, San Francisco and New York. They connected with the east coast through Nicaragua.



1008 Greenhood & Newbauer Express / Weaverville, Cal., blue company oval on 3¢ red (U10) buff entire to San Francisco Cal. with Greenhood & Newbauer, Northern Express printed frank, **fresh and Very Fine.**

Hopkinson's Express



Hopkinson's Express. Paid. Nevada, Red Dog, You Bet and Dutch Flat. (Thomas HOP-010) framed printed frank on 3¢ pink (U59) buff entire canceled by blue "Wells, Fargo & Co, Nevada, Mar 30" oval to San Francisco Cal., reverse with docketed from "Mrs. C. Dryman, Litte York, Nevada Co. Cal." and "Recd & Ansd - March 30. 1869"; reduced slightly at right, tiny top edge tear, Very Fine and choice, ex-Edwards; with 1980 P.F. certificate.

ONE OF ONLY TWO RECORDED EXAMPLES OF THIS FANCY HOPKINSON'S EXPRESS FRANK, A REMARKABLE CONJUNCTIVE WELLS FARGO USE.

The other recorded example of this rare frank is dated Mar. 23, 1869 from the same correspondence offered in the Siegel 2005 Rarity Sale in lot 656 realizing \$4,130.





1010 Pacific Express Co. Paid. (Thomas PAC-001) printed Horse and Rider frank with manuscript "*LR*" initials of Levi Robie on 10¢ green (U18) buff Nesbitt entire to Coila N.Y., endorsed "Mail at N.Y." at lower left, postmarked in transit "New York, Nov 14" cds; light tone spots, still a Very Fine and rare use, ex-Knapp. Estimate \$1,000 - 1,500

AN EXCEPTIONAL RARE PACIFIC EXPRESS CO. FRANK WITH LEVI ROBIE INITIALS ON A 10ϕ ENTIRE TO THE EAST COAST.

It is believed the manuscript initials applied in the area around the front legs of the horse were an approval for express usage that appeared early in the life cycle of Pacific Express Co.

1011 Pacific Express, Paid (Thomas PAC-001) illustrated running pony express frank on 10¢ green (U18) buff Nesbitt entire canceled by partial blue "Pacific Express Co., San Francisco, Oct 20" double-circle datestamp to Boston Mass., entered mails with "New-York, Nov 13" cds; some edge wear and light creasing at top, Very Fine, ex-Edwards. Estimate \$200 - 300



1012 (Tracy & Co.) Salmon River & Nez Perces Express, Paid 50 Cents (Thomas TRA-604) boxed frank and additional Wells, Fargo & Co., printed frank on 3¢ pink (U34) entire canceled by "Wells, Fargo & Co., Portland, Jul 10" oval datestamp to Oregon City, Oregon; some edge wear, reduced slightly at right, F.-V.F. and scarce Idaho express use, ex-Edwards.

Estimate \$500 - 750

Edward Tracy (1861-62) started applying a surcharge (50¢, 75¢ and \$1.00 rates) to envelopes for service between the Salmon River and Nez Perces mining are in Idaho and Walla Walla, Washington Territory, where Wells, Fargo & Co. provided connections to other locations. When Wells Fargo bought out Tracy in April 1862, they continued to honor the Tracy surcharge printed frank.

Pacific Stage & Express Co.



1013 Pacific Stage & Express Co., Paid. (Thomas PAS-003) printed oval express frank illustrated with four-horse stagecoach on 3c pink (U34) buff entire canceled by mostly clear blue "P.S. & E. Co., Nevada" circular handstamp (PAS-100) from the Hill correspondence to San Francisco Cal., reverse with "June 23, 1864" docketing; reduced slightly at right, Very Fine, ex-Edwards.

ONE OF ONLY TWO RECORDED EXAMPLES OF THIS WONDERFUL PACIFIC STAGE & EXPRESS CO. FRANK.

Pacific Stage & Express Co. was operated by James McCue and Michael Rees between 1860 and 1864. It ran between San Francisco and Sacramento, to Virginia City, Nevada. This express operated through the Henness Pass north of Lake Tahoe to Virginia City. It operated from this terminus of the Central Pacific Railroad as it pushed through the Sierras to Virginia City.

Wood & Co's Express



Estimate \$2,000 - 3,000

On Nov. 2nd 1867, Wood & Co.Æs Express announced service from Susanville to Oroville, connecting with Wells, Fargo & Co.Æs Express at Oroville. Service was shortly thereafter extended from Oroville and Chico to Longville, Greenville, Taylorville, Susanville and all intermediate places. It was announced May 30th 1868 that "Wood & Co. have sold out their Express line from Susanville to Oroville to Wells, Fargo & Co.".

1017 Windsor Locks, Ct., Dec 10, bold strike of first type fancy illustrated Steamboat in Lock postmark in red with month in type (Duffney type Ia) and red ms. "Free" rating with ms. "C.H. Dexter, P.M." postmaster free frank on 1840 folded letter to Springfield, Mass., letter in postmaster's hand; file folds, **Very Fine and choice.**

A BOLD DESIRABLE EXAMPLE OF THE FIRST TYPE OF WINDSOR LOCKS FANCY ILLUSTRATED STEAMBOAT IN LOCK POSTMARK.

Alfred Smith, president of the Enfield Falls Canal Company, proposed to change the name of Pine Meadow to Windsor Locks. The Windsor Locks Post Office was opened in 1833 and was located in a store near a grist mill owned by Charles Haskell Dexter. He was eventually appointed first postmaster.



1018 (Orleans Territory) New Orleans, Aug 14, neat forwarding cds and ms. "Free" rating on 1806 folded letter with "C. Swan, Pmstr." free frank entering the mails with "Washington City, Jul 7" origin cds and matching "Free" rating handstamp to New Orleans, forwarded to Fort Adams, Very Fine and choice forwarded free frank use.

Estimate \$500 - 750

Caleb Swan was Paymaster of the Army from May 8th 1792 until June 30th 1808. The position was later renamed in 1816 as Paymaster General of the United States.







1020 "Skokomish, W.T., 4th Sept 1868", manuscript postmark ties 3¢ red, F grill (94) on orange cover to Seattle, Wash. Territory; 3¢ trivial tiny tear, Very Fine and scarce Washington Territory use.

Express Covers



1021 Campbell's Stage Line, U.S. Mail & Express, Traverse City Mich., pristine illustrated corner card featuring two-team Stagecoach with caption "From Traverse City to Railroad" bearing 3¢ green (147) tied by cork cancel duplexed with "Traverse City Mich., Jun 23" cds to Frankfort Mich., pencil "Mailed June 21 - 1871" docketing; reduced slightly at right, Very Fine and rare.

Estimate \$500 - 750

Robert A. Campbell, proprietor of "Campbell's Stage Line" of Traverse City, was born in Franklin County, N.Y., Jan. 18, 1840. In 1859 he came to Traverse City, Mich. where he was for some time in the employ of Hannah, Lay & Co., and then spent some time in farm work. He later spent three years as baker and confectioner before starting the stage business on the Big Rapids, Cadillac, Fife Lake, Elk Rapids, Northport, Glen Arbor and Frankfort lines. The April 1886 Traverse News noted R. A. Campbell had sold his Traverse City and Frankfort stage route to W. M. Gates of Frankfort, who takes it on Friday of this week.

Stellwagen & Kraetzer, Buffalo N.Y. corner card cover to St. Avold, France, endorsed "By French Mail" at top, "Buffalo N.Y., Mar 31, 1860" cds and matching "15" oval rating handstamp, "New York '3' Apr 3" debit exchange cds, French (4.16.60) entry cds and "8" decimes due handstamp, reverse with Paris (4.17) transit and St. Avold arrival cds; bit of abrasion at top, Very Fine.

Waterway Covers



1023 Red River Packet Countess (Milgram 299) sharp red oval handstamp on 3¢ red (U10) buff Nesbitt entire from the Carroll Hoy & Co. correspondence to New Orleans La.; edge tear just into oval, otherwise Extremely Fine and choice example of this rare handstamp.

Estimate \$500 - 750



John Marshall Stone (April 30, 1830 û March 26, 1900) was an American politician from Mississippi. With the outbreak of the American Civil War in 1861, Stone enlisted in the Confederate States Army that April. He commanded Company K of the 2nd Mississippi Infantry Regiment and saw action in Virginia. In 1862, Stone was elected colonel of his regiment. Stone was highly commended by his division commander Maj. Gen. Henry Heth, and in 1864, he frequently commanded the brigade. In January 1865, he recruited in Mississippi and commanded local troops countering Stoneman's 1865 Raid. He and his men were captured in North Carolina and imprisoned in Camp Chase, Ohio; later transferred to Johnson's Island, Ohio.

Joseph Brevard Kershaw (1822-1894) was an American planter and slaveholder from South Carolina. He was also a lawyer, judge, and a Confederate general in the American Civil War. At the start of the Civil War, Kershaw commanded the 2nd South Carolina Infantry Regiment. He was present at Morris Island in April 1861 during the Battle of Fort Sumter, and then in July 1861 at the First Battle of Manassas in Virginia as part of Brig. Gen. Milledge Bonham's brigade. He was commissioned brigadier general on 13 February 1862 and commanded a brigade in Joseph E. Johnston's Army of Northern Virginia during the Peninsula Campaign, at the close of which he continued with Lee and took part in the Northern Virginia Campaign and Maryland Campaign. During the Battle of Fredericksburg, on December 13, 1862, he commanded his South Carolina Brigade and was stationed behind Ransom's North Carolina Brigade and Cobb's Georgia brigade on Marye's Heights, and helped repulse several attacks made by the Union Army.

The following year he was engaged in the Battle of Gettysburg and then was transferred with Lt. Gen. James Longstreet's corps to the West, where he took part in the charge that destroyed the Federal right wing at Chickamauga. After the relief of McLaws following the battle of Knoxville Kershaw was given the command of the division and promoted to major general on 2 June 1864. When Longstreet returned to Virginia, he commanded a division in the battles of the Wilderness, Spotsylvania Court House, and Cold Harbor, and was engaged in the Shenandoah campaign of 1864 against Maj. Gen. Philip Sheridan. After the evacuation of Richmond, his troops formed part of Lt. Gen. Richard S. Ewell's corps, which was captured on 6 April 1865 at the Battle of Sayler's Creek. He was held at Fort Warren.

The "J. Coder" designation was for John Coder known used Feb. 8th to Jun. 20th 1865.


